Gracefully Green, an A Lot to Grow, Inc. garden is on the grounds of the Glen Ridge Congregational Church, 195 Ridgewood Ave., Glen Ridge. The garden was established in conjunction with the 125th Anniversary of this church. The garden consists of eight raised beds, six designed to grow vegetables for local soup kitchens and food pantries.

Judy Hinds at 156 Rhoda Ave., Nutley, invites visitors to see what has over-wintered and what new-season seeds are up. First-come first-served on divisions of some perennial herbs and other freebies.

## 2-4 PM

Necole Fabris, 8 Prospect Pl., West Orange, composts, uses leaves and grass clippings as ground cover, and uses natural pest control in her garden that provides much of her family's produce in the summer. She will be showing a brand new raised bed and potato bags along with the rain barrel she has had for several years.

Pat Kenschaft's garden at 56 Gordonhurst Ave., Montclair, yields almost all her family's vegetables year round, and some fruit. She also does all her own landscaping with no poisons, commercial fertilizers, or power machinery. There will be environmental displays in the front yard.
