As usual, I plan to have a self-guiding sheet with highlights to the numbered areas. C'mon by and see what's happening (or may not be yet!)."

**2:00 - 5:00 PM**

**156 Rhoda Ave., Nutley:** From Montclair, drive east on Watchung to the end. Turn left onto East Passaic. Take the second right onto Coeyman. After going under the high tension wires, take the next left onto Stanley, then the first left onto Rhoda. 156 is on the right with a big oak tree on the front lawn.

**Alan Smith** offers a self-guided front yard tour of a garden that includes a variety of greens.

**148 Forest St., Montclair:** From Watchung and Grove, drive south to Chestnut St. and turn right. After the train underpass, turn left on Forest. 148 is on the right.

### Pat Kenschaft says:

"My garden is also very late this year. Garlic did well this this winter, but it didn't have much company. For years I have raised all my family's vegetables year round with no poisons or power machinery, but that record may be broken soon. Or maybe not! Meanwhile, there are interesting plants to see and tales to tell."

**2:00 - 4:00 PM**

**56 Gordonhurst Ave., Montclair:** From Watchung and Grove, drive two blocks north on Grove and turn right on Gordonhurst. Third house on the right. Come by 3:30 for a complete tour.
