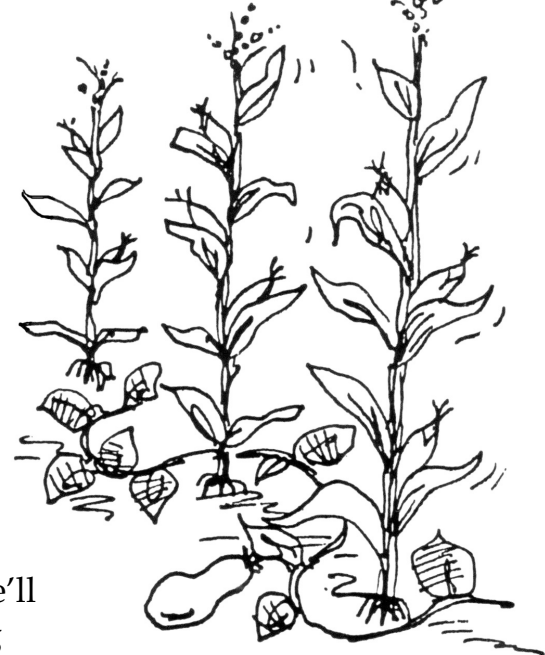
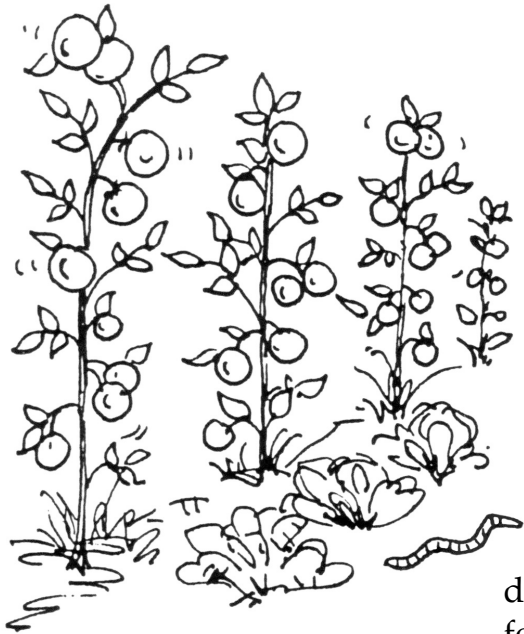

The Presbyterian Church of Upper Montclair, at 53 Norwood Ave., Montclair, joined forces with Glen Ridge based non-profit "A Lot to Grow" to start an organic vegetable garden on the church grounds to serve the Montclair community. Since launching this spring, PCUM garden volunteers have been sharing the responsibility for its care and donating its harvest to the Human Needs Food Pantry on a weekly basis (over 100 lbs. so far). Judy Hinds' garden at 156 Rhoda Ave., Nutley: Come see what's still growing even with diminishing light and warmth. We'll focus on greens and soil-enriching green "manures." Tour sheet, tips and recipes. Bring kids. Dogs on leash, okay. 973-661-0067.

Florence Rollino at 45 Wells Ct., Bloomfield, has a beautifully landscaped property, tucking vegetables in among other fascinating displays. From Montclair, take Bellevue Ave. east almost to the end at ShopRite. Take the last left (Bellevue Terr.), and then the first left onto Wells Ct.; number 45 is the house at the end with solar panels.

Alan Smith at 148 Forest St., Montclair, offers a self-guided front yard tour of a garden that includes a variety of greens.

Pat Kenschaft's garden at 56 Gordonhurst Ave., Montclair, has provided almost all the family's vegetables year round for decades, with no poisons, power machinery, or commercial fertilizers. Notice that this tour ends at 4:00 PM. * Nobody will be allowed in the back yard after that, so come by 3:30, if you want the complete tour.

There will be environmental displays (but no butterflies) in the front yard.
